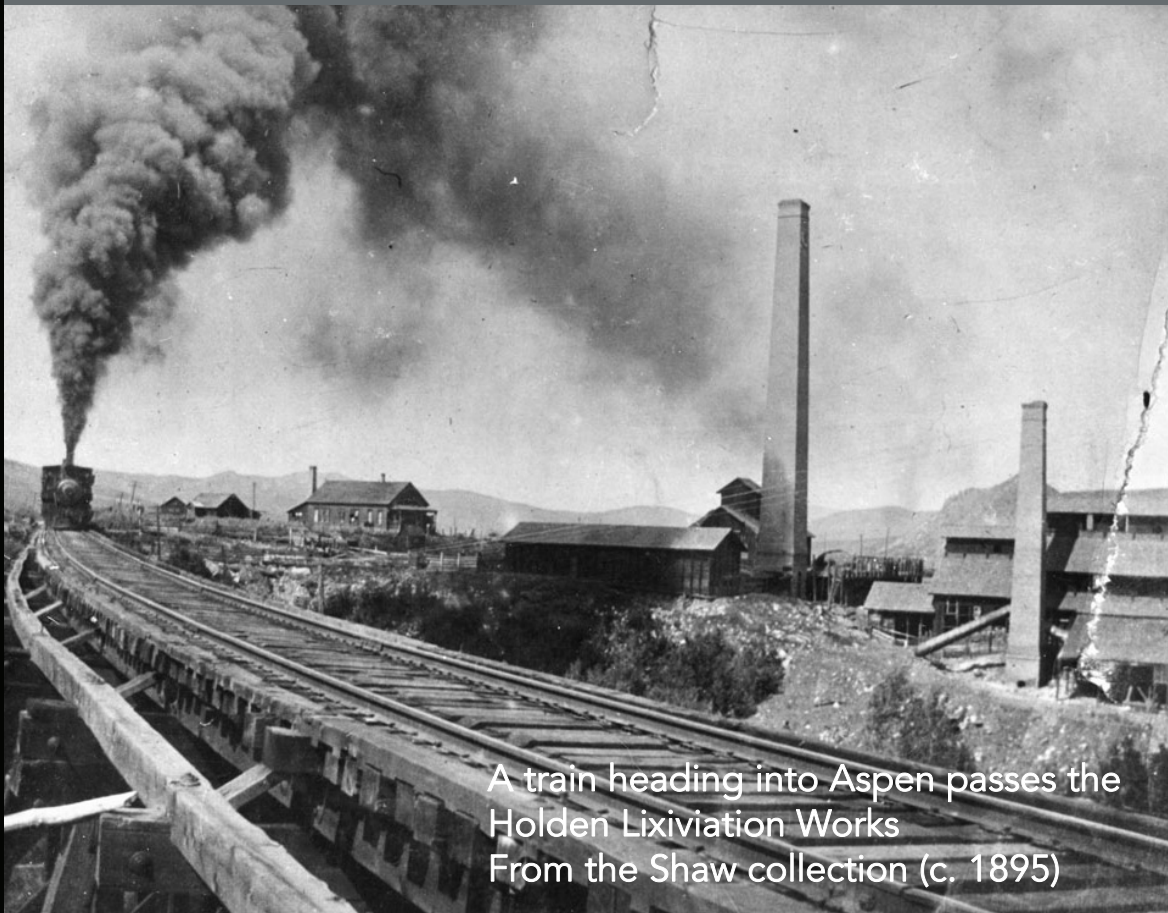

All This Month at the Holden/Marolt Barn



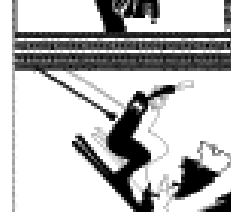
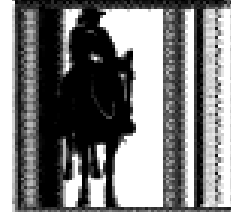
A train heading into Aspen passes the Holden Lixiviation Works

July 7 – “Carl Bergman Gets Steaming Rad!” will showcase the Holden/Marolt’s biggest supporter and promoter in a talk about the history, power and use of steam, how the calliope works as well as live demonstrations of different engines. July 14 – “Gonzo Tuesday: Jay Cowan on Hunter Thompson” is an evening with author and Thompson crony Jay Cowan talking about the gonzo journalist and his life and times in Aspen. We will also be showing the BBC production “High Noon in Aspen” about Thompson’s run for Pitkin County sheriff in 1970. Holden/Marolt Mining and Ranching Museum, 5:30 PM, \$5, members free.

July 21 – “The Great Train Race: Rail Comes to the Roaring Fork Valley” features Jan Girardot of the Glenwood Railroad Museum and the Aspen Historical Society’s Mike Monrone relating the details of one of the Roaring Fork Valley’s most exciting times.
